## Access to Primary Care Service (APC) PROVIDES NEEDED SUPPORT TO ATTEND CRITICAL MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

ealthy communities are built on improving access to primary health care. Attending medical appointments in a regular and timely manner ensures that patients stay healthier, get connected to the right care, and are less likely to require treatment in acute care settings. This is especially true for seniors and those with complex and chronic conditions who often require more assistance.

Simply having a family physician or nurse practitioner is not enough. Many individuals have difficulty attending appointments because they require support to get there. The ability to attend appointments is affected by impaired mobility, cognitive deficits, and unavailable caregiver support.

Community Care Peterborough's Access to Primary Care (APC) service provides accompaniment support by a Personal Support Worker (PSW) to seniors and individuals living with complex, high needs who would not otherwise be able to attend medical appointments. The service is intended for people attending primary care appointments who require more support than can be provided by family, a volunteer driver, or accessible transportation.

Catherine<sup>\*</sup> lives with chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and a heart condition. She worries about falls. She uses a walker and not too long ago she fractured her leg. She does not have family or other support nearby. Catherine's home has 2 steps and no railing. The APC PSW provides physical assistance to help Catherine in and out of the house safely and to manage her walker in and out of the vehicle. The PSW also goes into the doctor's office with her to take notes about what the doctor said. This helps Catherine remember important information about her health care. Back at home, the PSW helps her get settled before leaving. "They even wipe the wheels on the walker when they bring it back in so it doesn't track in dirt!" Catherine says that she "would be lost without this help" and that



she needs more help than a volunteer or a taxi driver can offer.

The establishment of the Access to Primary Care service (APC) has given health service providers and patients somewhere to turn when it is evident that a patient requires support to attend critical medical appointments. It can also play a role in supporting frail older adults to live healthier at home and reduce unnecessary hospital visits.

APC is available for individuals who meet the eligibility criteria across the City and County of Peterborough. Clients who do not require the support of a PSW will be referred to Community Care's volunteer driving service, the Caremobile, or the CCP van.

Mona and Ernie Ferguson, 88 and 92 years old respectively, say they found the key to a long and healthy life, and that key is volunteering for Meals on Wheels.

Mona celebrates 50 years as a volunteer with the program this month, which makes her the longest serving volunteer in Community Care history in Peterborough.

Ernie first joined his wife as a Meals on Wheels volunteer 29 years ago when he retired from his East City dry cleaning business, Ferguson's.

Mona believes that people who deliver the meals are a special breed. "There are the 'me' people and the 'we' people. Meals on Wheels people are 'we' people," she quips.

The couple, who admit they are finally slowing down and stepping back from their regular monthly deliveries, say they had a "big route" each time, where they'd deliver 12 hot meals and then do the frozen meal delivery afterwards.

"We got to know our people," she says. "And they always knew when the Fergusons were coming." The two delivered smiles, happiness and joy along with the food. "Most of the people we delivered to were younger than us," Mona notes. "And they remember the love, not the food."

Community Care staff estimate that the agency delivers about 325 hot meals a week in Peterborough at a cost of \$8 each and also delivers frozen meals for clients to heat up over the weekends when there is no delivery.

During an interview at the couple's dining room table, Mona comments on the priceless value volunteering has on quality of life, and says, "I'm convinced the two of us wouldn't be alive today if it weren't for our volunteering."

Ernie linked forces with his wife after she had logged countless volunteer hours all over town,

working with school breakfast programs, taking people to x-ray at the Peterborough Hospital and as a driver for Children's Aid.

His pride in his wife's many talents shines through his words. "When I was running the dry cleaning business we could call Mona at the drop of a hat to come in and drive the truck or work as cashier," he says, beaming at his wife.

The two are well-known seniors on the Peterborough scene, and when younger, were ice skating dance champions of Peterborough. They have two daughters and a son.

The two supply one another's history with helpful details. She fondly reels her husband in when he starts to reminisce about recently finding his mouth organ, which he used to play every night at bedtime years ago for his two daughters.

"I'd play when the Saints Go Marching In and the two of them would march around in the living room in their pyjamas until they were tired, and then go to bed." (The Fergusons are now grandparents to six children and great grandparents to three.)

"Ernie," she interjects, "the interview." Ernie returns to the topic at hand with a chuckle, and the two agree that volunteering is a component of good mental health.

"If people would only volunteer, they'd be so much happier," says Mona.

And Ernie adds, "Other volunteers are the most wonderful people in the world." Mona nods in agreement, her eyes twinkling.

"It's a chance to deliver love along with the food," says Mona. "We never met a single person on our delivery route that we didn't like."
