Volunteer Transportation and Deliveries

This support program is our most needed one in Apsley. We keep our volunteer drivers busy with grocery excursions, trips to the Foodbank, and shopping and delivery services. This access to grocery-related services has remained steady, and now with cottage season ending, we are beginning to see an increase and anticipate it will steadily increase during the winter months.

"I don't know what I would have done without grocery delivery from Community Care. I can't drive anymore, and I'm busy caring for my child that has significant health issues. They matched me with two volunteers that call me each once a month and help me plan my order, they then go do the shopping for me and deliver to my house and it doesn't cost me anything," said a client. "Community Care also has a volunteer that picks food up for me from the Foodbank and delivers this to me every week. I am very grateful to have this service."



Meals On Wheels

Your Be A Lifeline dollars continue to be used for Meals On Wheels subsidies, and we have seen a steady increase in Meals On Wheels clients since December 2020.

Our volunteers deliver more than just a meal, they too can be a lifeline, fighting social isolation one client at a time.

"I used to go to Sayers every day because I didn't have to plan meals and I always liked to pick up the newspaper there. Now that it's gone, I no longer get to visit with the Sayer's family and staff, I miss them. Community Care has helped me by paying for monthly Meals On Wheels so I don't have to worry. It's been nice to meet some of Community Care's drivers and delivery volunteers, they are very nice to me and I enjoy the grocery trips to Bancroft. It's nice to have someone else to talk to and to be able to get out of town from time to time."

The proceeds from our thrift store are our biggest ongoing fundraiser to support the annual cost of running our service office in Apsley. The generosity of our full-time and seasonal residents makes for a very high volume of thrift store donations. When we moved to a larger space in 2019, our vision was to be able to showcase more items than we were previously able to, as well as feature some of our local artists and artisans on consignment. Our volunteers also work very hard to ensure a great shopping experience, and we strongly encourage you to shop in our store, not only are you supporting our services, but you are supporting local artists too.

Did You Know?

We established a **Meet Your Needs (MYN) program** in 2019 to ensure community members do not go without suitable clothing, footwear and outerwear. Before the establishment of MYN, we hosted an event annually at the North Kawartha Community Centre. It was determined that one annual event was not enough to respond to a growing demographic of individuals and families in need of these items. Now, eligible community members can access the items they need through our thrift store, year-round, any day or time, and their confidentiality is always ensured.

Given the remoteness of our community, our Apsley office often finds ourselves serving clients that fall outside our traditional scope of practice.
